

Death of J. W. R. Collins

James W. R. Collins, private secretary to General Passenger Agent James H. Wood, of the Pennsylvania Railroad, died yesterday, at the Hahnemann Hospital, from appendicitis. Mr. Collins entered the service of the road twenty years ago. He was taken ill on Friday, and was removed to the hospital on Sunday afternoon, when an operation was performed. Mr. Collins was prominent in the Scottish societies of this city. He had been Mr. Wood's secretary since 1882. He was forty years of age, and resided at Mount Airy. A widow and six children survive him.
